#### **DELAWARE COUNTY UPDATED RECYCLING RULES**

All garbage and recyclables must be bagged. **WHITE OR CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS** are required for both garbage and recyclables. Glass, Cans & Plastic may be put in the same bag. Please keep bags of recyclables separated form bags of garbage. Do not place them in the same garbage can, **NO YARD WASTE IS ACCEPTED.** 

### GLASS:

- 1. The glass should be limited to new and used glass food and beverage containers which have been rinsed and are free of food contamination. Labels may be left on.
- 2. Clear, Brown, Green glass can be recycled.
- 3. METAL OR PLASTIC CAPS MUST BE REMOVED. Throw them away with regular trash.
- 5. DO NOT RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

Plates, Crockery or Pottery, Pyrex, Drinking Glasses, Cut Glass, Mirrors or Toilets, Plate Glass, Window Glass, Lead Glass, Light Bulbs or Neon Tubes, No Broken Jars or Bottles.

### CANS:

- 1. Steel or aluminum food and beverage containers must be recycled.
- 2. The cans MUST BE RINSED CLEAN, labels may be left on.
- 3. Tops or bottoms do not need to be removed nor is it necessary to flatten the cans.
- 4. DO NOT RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

Aluminum foil, Aerosol cans, Paint cans and Trays.

<u>Please Note:</u> Pie plates and cake tins that usually come with store bought bakery goods may be recycled if they are washed clean.

#### PLASTIC:

- 1. Plastic beverage containers (such as milk, water bottles, or soda bottles...etc) can be recycled.
- 2. Containers MUST BE RINSED AND CLEAN and the lids removed.
- 3. Look for the recycling emblem on the bottom or side of the container. Recycle #'s 1 through # 7.
- 4. White or colored plastic containers for soap, detergents, bleach and fabric softener can be recycled. Please rinse these containers and REMOVE ALL LIDS.
- 5. DO NOT RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

Motor oil, Clear Plastic Wrap, Plastic Silverware, Plastic Pipe or Hose, Plastic Bags, Styrofoam (Plates, Cups, Meat Containers), Rigid Plastic Pails.

#### **NEWSPAPER:**

All newspaper must be bundled or bagged. What comes in the newspaper stays with the newspaper.

#### **MAGAZINES:**

**All magazines must be bundled or bagged.** Junk mail, Office and Computer paper, post-it notes, envelops may be recycled with magazines. DO NOT INCLUDE waterproof or Tyvex mailers, plastic over wrap, carbon paper, padded envelops, books and spiral binding.

## CARDBOARD:

- 1. All corrugated cardboard is recyclable and must broken down flat and bundled. Corrugated cardboard is the type of cardboard that is wavy between layers. Brown paper bags are also recyclable.
- 2. DO NOT RECYCLE THE FOLLOWING:

Food Boxes (cereal, food mixes, etc...), Mailing and shipping tubes, poster board, packing paper such as inserts, and pizza boxes.

## Note: All batteries are recyclable.

# C&D (Construction and Demolition Debris/Furniture):

- Bale wrap, Hoses, Carpeting/flooring, Plastic and Vinyl sheeting, etc... Keep separate from regular trash. Small
  quantities may be taken with regular pick up, however, we request that you call the office to schedule
  removal of these items. There are additional charges for removal of these items. Other additional
  charge items include: TV'S, microwaves, freezers and refrigerators, fans, air conditioners, pots and pans, etc...
- 2. We have Roll-Off Container service to accommodate medium/large "clean ups", renovations, etc... please call to schedule.

#### Hazardous Materials:
